

## MESSAGE FROM THE CHANCELLOR

### HON. DR. GIDEON KIPSIELEI TOWETT MOI

This momentous occasion gives us the opportunity to celebrate the graduation of **1,800** being conferred with degrees and awarded diplomas and certificates of Kabarak University. Congratulations to all of you!

The students we are graduating today have drunk from the fountain of knowledge founded and made accessible by **The Second President of Kenya, H.E. President Daniel Toroitich Arap Moi** some 22 years ago. We are proud of our Founding Chancellor; and we are proud of you – our graduates. You have achieved this milestone because of your hard work, determination, sacrifice and dedication. Your achievement today is a step towards a bright future, both for you and for our nation. In you, we see an empowered nation.



The rigorous education you have received in this University is a life-time treasure. You are very lucky to have received your education in a world class university that teaches and requires students to assimilate and demonstrate in daily life the core values of **integrity, excellence, professionalism, patriotism, being mindful of others, innovativeness and creativity**. I urge you to cherish and uphold these values twenty-four hours of each day of your life. The Bible – the Word of God – is the truth. The Bible says in Ephesians 6:14, *"Stand firm then, with the belt of truth buckled around your waist"*. Truth and integrity are synonymous. With truth and integrity, you will have nothing to fear. With truth and integrity, you will go very far. Brene Brown, a Professor at the University of Houston, has simplified the definition of integrity. *"Integrity is choosing courage over comfort; choosing what is right over what is fun, fast, or easy; and choosing to practice our values rather than simply professing them."*

Now that you have been imbued with knowledge in this University, your next step is to seek wisdom on how to apply the knowledge. From this moment onwards, you are going to chart the right path for your life. But, to walk along that path, you will need integrity at every stage and in everything you do. C.S. Lewis, the Irish-born scholar, said that *"Integrity is doing the right thing, even when no one is watching."*

In addition to integrity, Kabarak University is also built on the foundation of excellence as a fundamental core value. That is why this University has set up high standards of quality objectives to meet the stringent requirements for your graduation, for accreditation by the Commission for University Education and for ISO 9001:2015 Certification.

Our dear graduates, think of excellence as the rigorous training the athletes go through to win the prize of excellence – the Gold Medal. Today you are becoming our graduates and our alumni as our elite athletes.

In addition to excellence, embrace patriotism. Put the interests of your country before your need for personal gain. Being mindful of others is one of the core values the Founder and the First Chancellor of this University held very dear in his heart. It is what the Bible tells us to do in Philippians 2: 3- 4, *"Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves, not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others."*

In a nutshell, integrity, excellence, and patriotism, are the core values that hold the key to your future success. I could share with you other virtues, but time would not permit.



## MESSAGE FROM THE VICE-CHANCELLOR

**PROF. HENRY K. KIPLANGAT, PhD, MBS, OGW.**

It is with great joy and honor that I welcome you to the **18<sup>th</sup> Graduation Ceremony of Kabarak University**. I sincerely thank you for honoring us with your presence. For those who are following the ceremony on television or through the various media channels, please know that we deeply appreciate your virtual presence in this ceremony. Whether you are here or following virtually, kindly accept my profound appreciation for finding time to honor us with your presence.

Today we are graduating and celebrating **1,800** candidates who have successfully completed their studies in various academic programs in this University. Among the candidates graduating today are two (2) Doctor of Philosophy students graduating with **Doctor of Philosophy in Music** from the School of Music and Media. The graduation of the two candidates with Doctor of Philosophy in Music is a fulfillment of one of the dreams of the Founder of this University, **H.E. President Daniel Toroitich Arap Moi**, who had a vision for the University to offer programs in Music. Mzee Moi treated Music as an integral part of his philosophy of **peace, love and unity**. He viewed Music as an effective instrument in the ministry of healing, reconciliation, and praise and worship of the Almighty God. Like all the candidates graduating today, our two PhD in Music candidates are a direct answer to Mzee Moi's prayer and the fruit of his investment.



We are cognizant of the strategic goals set by the Ministry of Education. In line with those goals, we are progressively positioning the University to enroll at least 60% of our students in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) related areas. Pursuant to this goal, this year the University developed additional new academic programs geared to meet the needs of our national, regional and international stakeholders. To this end, the new programs that have been approved by the Commission for University Education and have been mounted in the University this year include Master of Science in Clinical Medicine, Master of Science in Nursing, Master of Public Health, Bachelor of Agricultural Education and Extension, and Bachelor of Arts in Chaplaincy.

To solidify our strength in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM), we have, this year, developed additional market-driven STEM programs. Among them are Bachelor of Science in Medical Laboratory Sciences, Bachelor of Science in Forensics and Molecular Sciences, and Bachelor of Science in Data Science and Analytics. At postgraduate level, we have developed Master of Pharmacy in Oncology Pharmacy, Master of Science in Artificial Intelligence, and Master of Science in Data Science. Those programs are currently undergoing review and approval by the Commission for University Education. We expect to mount them next year.

We are also diversifying our program portfolio beyond STEM courses in line with the Competency Based Education aspirations. For this reason, we have this year developed two strategic programs in visual arts and performing arts, namely Bachelor of Film and Theatre, and Master of Film and Theatre. Those programs are currently undergoing review and approval by the Commission for University Education. We expect to mount them next year.

Furthermore, to align the University with the aspirations of the CBC and national goals, the University has this year established the Kabarak University TVET Institute at our Nakuru City Campus. The Institute admitted pioneer students this year following an assessment by the Technical and Vocational Education and Training Authority (TVETA). Students who successfully complete their vocational studies in the Institute will have the opportunity to progress to degree courses in the University.

This year the University continued to remain vibrant in Research, Innovation and Outreach activities. Once again, the University successfully hosted the **12<sup>th</sup> International Research Conference**. The Conference attracted notable national and international keynote and guest speakers drawn from the industry, corporate world, and academia.

Our investment in research, innovation and outreach is beginning to bear fruits. Today I am proud to report that **twenty-five (25)** members of our academic staff were listed in the *AD Scientific Index 2023 – Kenya*, a reputable ranking and analysis system based on the scientific performance and added value of the scientific productivity of individual scientists. The appearance of 25 members of our staff in this Index is an indication that our members of staff are actively involved in scientific research and publication. In addition, some three innovations from our students and staff have been presented to Kenya Industrial Property Institute for copyright protection and commercialization.



Meaningful research requires sufficient funding. This year we received generous grants from Google/Cape Town Science Centre, to support outreach activity for Scratch Programming among Primary School Children digital literacy program. We also received a generous grant from the Notre Dame-IBM Tech Ethics Lab to support research on Ethical Issues in Healthcare Machine Learning Projects. Another grant came from Mustard Seed Foundation to support training on integration of faith and learning.

One of the landmark initiatives in the University this year was the establishment of the **Kabarak University Press**. The University Council, upon the recommendation of the University Senate, had approved the establishment of the Kabarak University Press in 2021. The main objective for the establishment of the University Press was to publish and promote the dissemination of academic publications. Today I am pleased to inform this congregation that we have put in place a competent team of editorial staff that has steered the University Press to a successful take-off. Within a short time after its launch, the Kabarak University Press led by the Dean Prof. John Osogo Ambani and the Editor-in-Chief, Humphrey Sipalla, have published some three magnificent masterpieces, much to the delight of Law students, the legal fraternity and the civic society.

I am pleased to inform this Congregation that the Kabarak University Press is meeting and exceeding our expectations. For instance, early this year, Kabarak University Press edited and published Prof. Willy Mutunga's inaugural lecture as a sessional academic monograph. For those who may not know, Prof. Willy Mutunga is the Chief Justice Emeritus and Professor of Public Law at Kabarak University School of Law.

In July this year, Kabarak University Press added another feather to the University with the publication of a remarkable seminal book authored by Prof. Githu Muigai, Attorney General Emeritus. We launched the book titled *Power, Politics and Law: The Dynamics of Constitutional Change in Kenya, 1897-2022*, on July 15, 2022.

On October 11, 2022, we launched another landmark book published by Kabarak University Press. The book titled *Decentralisation and Inclusion in Kenya: From Pre-Colonial Times to the First Decade of Devolution*, is divided into various chapters authored by Prof. John Osogo Ambani, Mr. Elisha Ongoya, Mr. Humphrey Sipalla, and Ms. Luciana Thuo – all from Kabarak University School of Law. The authors of other chapters are Ms. Petronella Mukaindo, Deputy Director, Kenya National Commission on Human Rights; and Ms. Caroline Kioko, Former Program Coordinator, Gender Democracy, Heinrich Boll Stiftung.

The Kabarak University Press has also this year published two distinctive academic journals, namely *the Journal of Law and Ethics*, and *the Kabarak University Students Law Review*.

Kabarak University Press has made us very proud. It has raised our public profile and reputation as a University. It has distinguished Kabarak University Law School as the good governance academy of Kenya's legal scholarship. We have indeed become a centre of excellence in legal pedagogy and a powerhouse in legal research and legal publications in the Eastern Africa region. Outstanding accolades are in order for the Dean Prof. John Osogo Ambani, the Chief Editor Mr. Humphrey Sipalla, and the entire editorial team for their outstanding performance.

Our School of Law has over the years risen to become a centre of excellence, as has been consistently demonstrated in the Moot Court competitions. In March, four (4) students from our Law School participated virtually in the African Rounds of the Annual H. Jackson Moot Court Competition. The competition was organized by the European Law Students' Association in collaboration with the World Trade Organization. Our Team was ranked *Best Team Overall*, and one of our students, Risper Anduru, was crowned the Best *Oralist* in the Final Round. Our team thus qualified to participate in the Global Final Rounds held at the World Trade Organization Headquarters in Geneva, Switzerland in June.

In late October and early November this year, six (6) of our Law School students participated in the Pan African Commercial International Chamber of Commerce Mediation Moot Competition held at Africa Nazarene University, Nairobi. Our team emerged the best and was declared winners of the gold medals and the winner's trophy. Our team thus qualified to represent Africa in the 18<sup>th</sup> Edition of the International Chamber of Commerce Mediation Moot Court Competition to be held in Paris, France in February 2023.

Kabarak University recognizes and awards staff who exemplifies academic, professional, and service excellence. To this end, the University conducts regular staff reviews and promotes staff on merit in accordance with the Commission for University Education criteria for promotion of academic staff. This year, the University successfully reviewed and promoted fourteen (14) members of staff. Two of them rose to the rank of Professor, three became Associate Professors, five were promoted to Senior Lecturer level, and four rose to the Lecturer position.

Our two new Professors are **Prof. Henry Kiptiony Kiplangat** (Professor of Educational Management and Leadership) and **Professor Simon Maina Karume** (Professor of Information Technology). The three new Associate Professors are **Prof. Simon Kibet Kipchumba** (Human Resource Management), **Prof. Betty Jeruto Tikoko** (Educational Management and Leadership), and **Prof. Christopher Mkiema Maghanga** (Physics).

Another significant achievement this year was the accreditation of Kabarak University Open Distance and E-Learning (ODEL) Centre by the Commission for University Education. The accreditation empowers the University to offer fully online accredited and globally recognized academic programs through our technology and digital hub known as Kabarak University Online (KABUO). Through this development, we now offer most of our postgraduate programs



through the fully online mode. A number of our students, especially the working class, have embraced this mode of delivery.

We have continued this year to establish strategic partnerships with various institutions. For instance, pursuant to the MoU we signed last year with the Kenya Institute for Public Policy Research and Analysis (KIPPRA), we hosted the KIPPRA Mentorship Program for Universities Regional Seminar. Participants came from the universities and colleges domiciled in the Rift Valley region. The objective of the seminar was to enhance the University community understanding of the public policy making process and the Big Four Agenda.

Another remarkable benefit from partnerships this year was the Central Rift Innovation Week, which the University hosted in partnership with the Kenya National Innovation Agency, various national government agencies, county governments, financial institutions, and non-governmental organizations. The event provided the University and participants with the platform to explore the opportunity for commercialization of research and innovations.

In addition, we have this year benefitted from the MoU we signed with the Media Council of Kenya last year. This year, the Media Council of Kenya has placed on internship all the thirteen (13) candidates we graduated from the Department of Mass Communication last year. We expect a similar windfall for our Mass Communication graduates this year. We are also getting positive results from our MoU with KCB Bank, where several of our graduates have landed appointments for internships and permanent placements with the bank.

We have in recent years experienced a steady growth in our academic programs and student population. This growth must be matched with commensurate upgrade and expansion of facilities. For this reason, the University this year constructed a magnificent **Conference Hall** with a seating capacity for **6,000 persons**. The Hall is constructed with customized steel structure. The walls and roofing are provided with adequate ventilation and sandwich panel insulation to minimize echo and external sound infiltration. All-round roof rainwater trappers are provided to harvest rainwater for the University farm. The construction has been completed and the Hall is ready for hosting large gatherings and mega conferences.

We have also completed extensive renovations in the School of Music and Media. As a result, the School now has modern teaching and learning facilities for music and media. The facilities are comprised of lecture rooms, practice rooms and recording studios.

We have also completed the landmark ultra-modern three-floor Library Complex in our Nakuru City Campus. The Complex houses the Campus Library, lecture halls, computer labs, and staff offices.

To meet the University transport needs, we have this year added a brand new 31-seater mini-bus and upgraded one of the old buses to boost our transport fleet.

Before I conclude my remarks, I wish to express my sincere and profound gratitude to our Honorable Chancellor, the University Board of Trustees, and the Governing Council. The milestones we have realized this year would not have been possible without the support and focused leadership we continue to receive from you.

I am also grateful to the Government of Kenya for giving freedom and support to school leavers to pursue their studies in universities of their choice, whether private or public. Many of them continue to choose Kabarak University and they have no regrets. With this commendation, I call on our national government to increase the capitation for student sponsorship to match the rate of inflation. It is increasingly becoming difficult for the universities to meet the high cost of tuition at the current rate of capitation from the government.

The two national hospitals and governments of various counties also deserve recognition and commendation for partnering with Kabarak University in various ways, including availing the referral and teaching hospitals, sub-county hospitals, and rural health centres as clinical attachment and internship sites for our Medical, Health Sciences and Pharmacy students. Due to this support, our students in Medicine and Health Sciences programs are performing exceptionally well. For instance, this year our BSc in Nursing students posted 97% pass rate in Nursing Council Licensure Examination for May 2022 examinations.

We are forever grateful to MedSend for supporting students in our Master of Medicine in Family Medicine program. The graduates from this program have landed senior leadership positions in various health facilities in the eastern African region.

We are equally grateful to our parents and guardians for supporting their sons and daughters to pursue their dreams in this University. We value your partnership and trust.

To our graduating class, words are not enough to express my appreciation. You have made us proud with your unrelenting pursuit of education and your commitment to the high standard of Biblical Christian values. You have demonstrated discipline and commitment to excellence in your academic pursuit. I am proud of you and convey to you my warmest congratulations and best wishes from the bottom of my heart. You have a bright future. God bless you our graduates; God bless you our parents, guardians, and sponsors. God bless Kabarak University.




